### Message from Mrs Anderson

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#### School applications

If your child was born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2020 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2021, it is time to consider Reception placements for September 2025. Further details about this, from the Local Authority, have been uploaded with this letter.

For pupils in year 6, please remember that the deadline for Secondary applications is 31<sup>st</sup> October.

#### <u>Attendance</u>

Please remember that if you are planning to take your child out of school, a Leave of Absence form must be completed and giving in to the school office 4 weeks ahead of the planned absence. Please also remember that no term time holidays are authorised and unauthorised absence may lead to referral to the LA or other outside agencies.

Parents are contacted, as part of school's policy and procedure, where attendance is of a concern. If a child's absence is of a concern, school can, at our discretion, choose to not authorise absence without medical evidence. Parents must also try to ensure that routine medical appointments, such as regular dental check-ups and opticians' appointments, are made outside of the school day.

#### If anyone is struggling financially

If any families are struggling financially, in the difficult current climate, I urge you to come and speak to school. Thanks to some funding received by school, we have supermarket vouchers that we can distribute which you could use as needed, whether it be for food, purchasing school uniform or even buying essentials like toiletries and sunscreen. These vouchers are not specifically for families in receipt of benefits. If any families are struggling, they are encouraged to contact school.

#### Safeguarding

At Dingle Community Primary, safeguarding is of the upmost importance. If you have any concerns regarding the safety of a child, please contact Mrs Anderson or Ms Heather for advice or support.

#### Parental conduct

Parents must be mindful of their own conduct at school. Verbal or physical aggression of any form towards members of staff will not be tolerated. Inappropriate conduct can lead to actions including parents being banned from school premises.

### School drop-off and collection, classes D to S

Please remember that the school doors open at 8.40am and children are expected to be in class by 8.45am when the doors will be closed. This is signalled by a bell. Children arriving after this time will need to come through the main office and will be registered as late. They must be signed in using the electronic system, for Health and Safety reasons.

The school day ends at 3.10pm and children must be collected by 3.15pm. If they are not collected by then, they will be taken to After School Club and charges will apply. Information on these charges can be found on the school website and have been implemented by the governing body.
