

## **A guide to behaviour for parents/ carers**

The aim is for all children to demonstrate positive learning behaviours in school that are Ready, Respectful and Safe. Should this not happen we have a pathway for all staff to follow in school.

Children who have demonstrated positive learning behaviours throughout the day are moved to gold.	Children receive a stamp in their behaviour book. Children's positive learning behaviours may be acknowledged with a star of the day badge, postcard home or star of the week in praise assembly.
By demonstrating positive learning behaviours children are able to move to silver on the behaviour board	Children's positive learning behaviours may be acknowledged with a star of the day badge, postcard home or star of the week in praise assembly. During the day they may be rewarded with Dojo points, stickers and verbal praise.
All children start the day on green on the behaviour board.	There will be minutes added to Golden Time if the class remain on green for a morning or afternoon session.
<u>Step 1- Verbal Reminder</u> When behaviour is not ready, respectful, or safe a discrete verbal reminder will be given, and a reminder of the expected behaviour will be shared.	This is an opportunity for the child to recover their behaviour and refocus on the learning.
<u>Step 2- Reflection</u> If behaviour continues, there will be an opportunity to use the reflection space in/ near to the classroom, to regulate and refocus.	The adult will outline the behaviour expectations at this point.
<u>Step 3- Warning</u> If behaviour continues, a logical consequence will be shared with the child so that they know what will happen should the behaviour continue.	
<u>Step 4- Consequence</u> If behaviour continues a consequence will be put in place.	This will be shared with parents at the end of the day by the class teacher. A restorative conversation will take place alongside or after the consequence.
<u>Step 5- A member of SLT may be called for serious incidents or persistent incidents.</u>	This will be shared with parents at the end of the day by a member of SLT.

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
