

History and Geography:

This term, the children will develop their Geographical skills by using simple fieldwork and observational skills to study their surrounding environment/locality, looking at key human and physical features, both locally and within the four countries of the United Kingdom. They will use simple compass directions and locational and directional language, to describe the location of features and routes on a map. Simple maps will be created with landmarks and aerial photographs explored. They will find out about our locality and how this has changed during recent history, including changes in the home and school.

Computing:

Pupils will learn to create digital writing, create media and programme animation.

Science:

The children will identify and name a variety of common, wild and garden plants. They will describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees. Working Scientifically, they will grow beans from seeds to observe changes closely and gather and record data. We will also continue to look at seasonal changes and explore the signs of Summer and the weather associated with

Physical Education:

In PE we will continue to develop our Fundamental Movement Skills. We will also develop skills in Athletics, in preparation for Sports Day!

Art and Design Technology:

In Art, the children will look at well-known artists and designers such as 'Andrew Goldsworthy', to sculpture simple designs/ideas, using natural materials, to make models and to compare their work with creativity and imagination.

In DT, the children will use ICT to explore design ideas. With a mini project of designing a shelter/home, they will make drawings of designs before exploring the skills of rolling, folding, tearing and cutting paper and card. We will make, bake and decorate 'Gingerbread Men' biscuits and design our own 'Gingerbread Houses'.

PSHRE (using 'One Decision')

Our PSHRE learning will focus on computer safety, online bullying, awareness of hazards, living in our world and growing in our world.

Music:

We will identify and describe pitch and explore the sounds created by a variety of different instruments and voices, describing their pitch and timbre. They will play simple listening games and identify simple pitch patterns in a range of songs and music.

Religious Education

In RE we will learn about our world, Judaism (artefacts, symbols, the synagogue and the Torah), people of faith (including Dr Barnardo and Florence Nightingale), qualities of good leaders and what faith really means.
