Complete the phonics blending or I spy sheet.

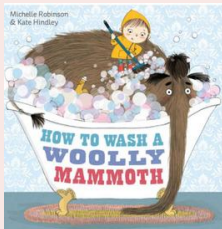
Practice tracing over your numbers, you can use pens, paint anything you like.

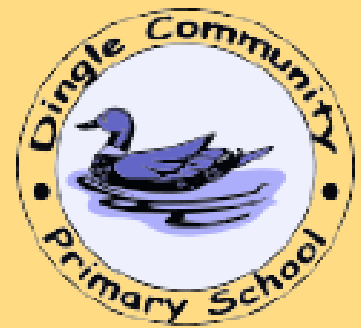

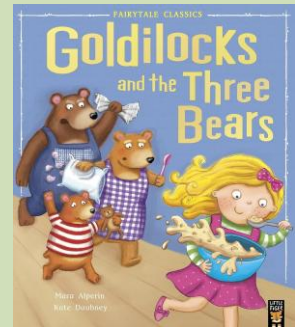
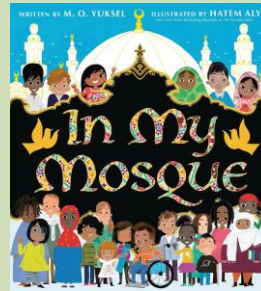
