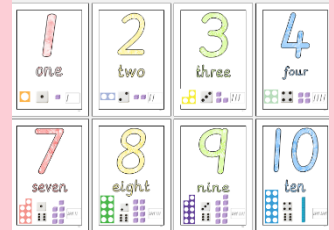
## A MESSAGE FROM THE TEAM

This week Groups Two and Three have been learning about ordering numbers and recognising amounts. Group Three have worked on representing numbers in different ways.

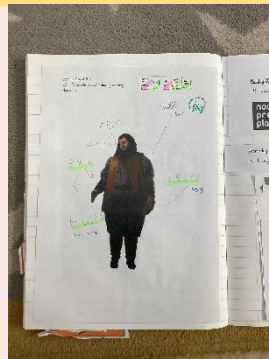
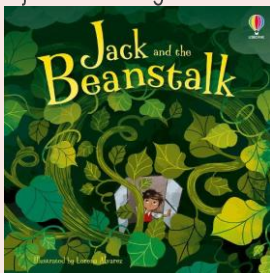


## WRITING

Wellcomm is a speech and language tool that helps support children's language and grammar skills. Group one have been learning about colours, while group two have been making complex comparisons.



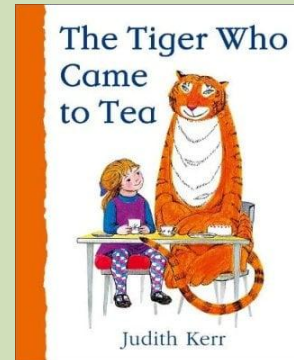
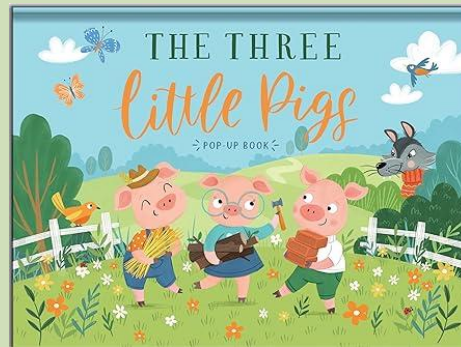

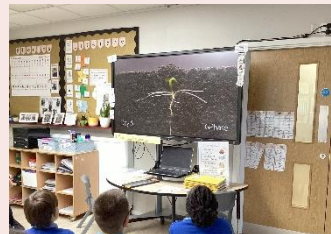


## SCIENCE
