MATHEMATICS

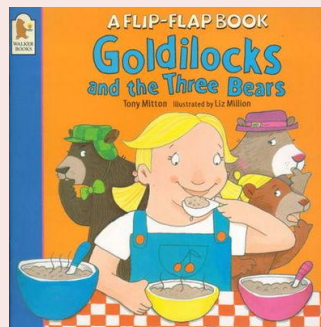
Group one have been learning about 1 more and 1 less. While group two have been practising their 2,3,5,10 times tables.

ATTENTION GROUP

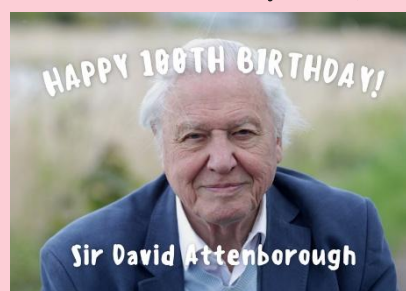
Sunshine, wind and sandcastles

As you may have seen on our Facebook page children have marked Sir David Attenborough turning 100 this week by sending him a card and questions. We have our fingers crossed for a response.

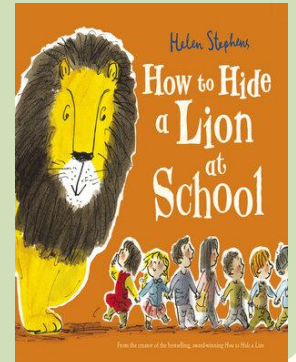
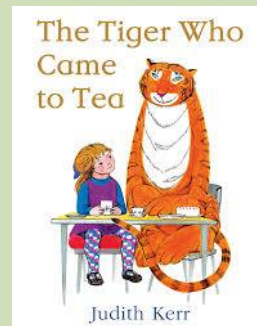
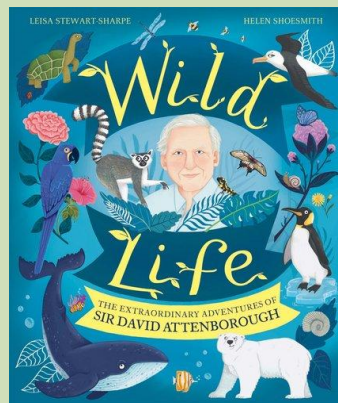
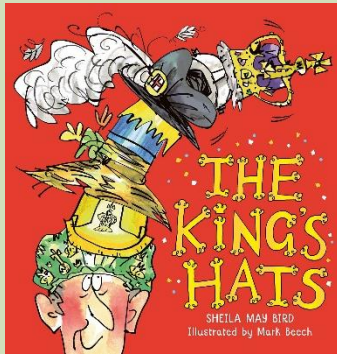

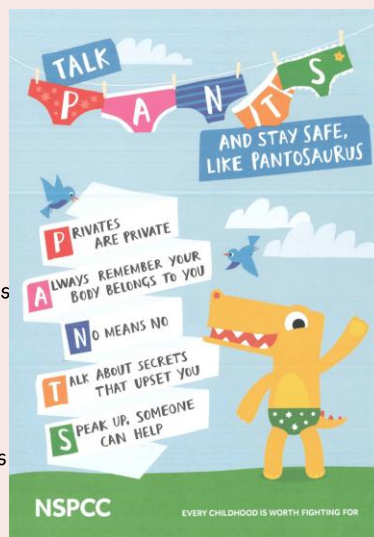
OTHER STORIES WE HAVE ENJOYED

We have spent time this past week focusing on expectations within the classroom through social stories. Children have explored what their role at Dingle is and our school rules, be ready, be respectful and be safe. Our focus this week has been respect and what this looks like. We have considered: how we treat others through our actions and our words. We have also discussed personal space and have used the term 'personal bubble' to say when someone is too close.
