A NOTE FROM THE TEAM

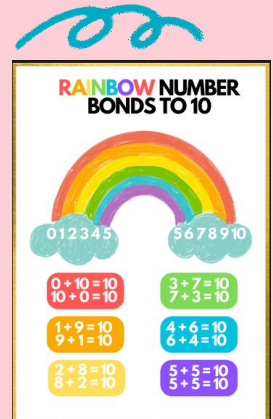

MATHEMATICS

Group One have been learning how numbers to 3 are made, while group two have been exploring their number bonds to 10.



SCIENCE

Exciting Experiments.

As a class we have been busy learning all about plants and their functions. This has linked superbly with our allotment where both potatoes and carrots have begun to grow. Children have explored how plants around the world vary depending on several factors, we call these changes adaptations.



We used our scientific minds to see how plants use their roots to absorb water and send it to the leaves. Children recorded how celery placed in coloured water changed the colour of the leaves over the week.
